

Teen to serve 28 years

19-year-old convicted of robbing elderly man at gunpoint days before Christmas

A Lynchburg teen convicted of tying an 81-year-old man and robbing him at gunpoint just four days before Christmas will spend more time in prison than has been alive.

Charles Horsley not only victimized

the man he robbed, said Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee, but Linkhorne middle and elementary schools were locked down that morning with news of a gunman on the loose, terrorizing students and their parents just four days before Christmas.

"This shook up the entire neighborhood," Felmlee told Lynchburg Circuit

Judge Mosby Perrow at a sentencing hearing Friday.

Horsley, 19, was sentenced to serve 28 years in prison.

Evidence in the case showed Horsley and co-defendant Stefan Hairston went to Theodore Trevey's Link Road home Dec. 21.

Hairston was allowed in under the pretense of bringing Trevey a Christmas present. Trevey said in February that Hairston had done yard work for him in the past.
