Man gets 23 years for role in robbery

A Lynchburg man who carried a sawed-off shotgun into a Campbell Avenue gas station in April, as part of the robbery and shooting of a clerk there, was sentenced to 23 years in prison on Friday.

Jonathan Jackson, 18, earlier pleaded guilty to robbery, aggravated malicious wounding, use of a firearm in commission of a felony and wearing a mask in public as part of the April 24 Citgo robbery.

Circuit Judge Mosby Perrow sentenced Jackson to 36 years in prison for that incident, with all but 15 years suspended.



It was during that robbery, Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmler said, that Jackson and three other men, including 21-year-old Kionne Pulley, robbed clerk Abderrahm Elfilali at gunpoint. Pulley, frustrated with
