Attorney: Woman a 'serial burglar'

Katie Hyatt's sentence now stands at more than 17 years in cases spanning 5 jurisdictions

A Concord woman called a "serial burglar" by a prosecutor Wednesday was sentenced to seven years in prison for her crimes in Lynchburg, bringing her total sentence thus far to 17 years and 71/2 Avenue. months.

Katie Carico Hyatt, 39, has been convicted of charges ranging from larceny and burglary to receiving stolen goods in Lynchburg and Appomattox, Bedford, Campbell and Albemarle counties.

Police have said Hyatt used the stolen property to stock her consignment shop, The Burnt Orange Upscale Resale on Fort Hvatt
