

Man gets 20 years in home robbery

Victim died 2 weeks
before the sentencing

Theodore Trevey didn't live long enough to see justice in the case of the Lynchburg man who stole his cash, jewelry and the sanctity of his home in a Christmastime robbery in 2010.

Trevey died Jan. 12, just two weeks before Stefan Hairston, 23, was sentenced for robbing the 81-year-old man at gunpoint in his Link Road home. The daytime robbery caused area schools to be locked down.

Hairston was sentenced to 20 years in prison.

Attorneys painted divergent portraits of Hairston.

The prosecution regarded him as the mastermind of the robbery, while defense witnesses described him as a follower, simply executing instructions out of fear.

Daniele Mason, who employed Hairston at her horse farm for four years, said he was a reliable worker who often had access to her home.

"If he was inclined to steal, he had a golden opportunity and never did," she said.

Hairston even replaced a rake he broke while working, using
