Man pleads guilty in car break-ins

Lynchburg resident sentenced to two years, eight months

A man accused of carrying out a rash of car breakins throughout a number of area neighborhoods in January pleaded guilty Monday in Lynchburg Circuit Court.

Anton Shantae Buckner, 26, of Lynchburg, pleaded guilty to eight counts of tampering with a vehicle and two counts of petit larceny, said Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee in an email Monday.

Following a plea agreement, Buckner was sentenced to two years and eight months.

He currently is serving his sentence in the Blue Ridge Regional Jail.

Felmlee said Buckner terrorized several Lynch-burg apartment complexes — including the New Towne development off
