

# Man's threat nets conviction

## Authorities say he tried to intimidate witness in shooting trial

A Lynchburg man was convicted of obstruction of justice Thursday after authorities said he tried to intimidate a witness in the January trial of a fellow gang member.

Jamall Randolph, 21, was convicted of the felony in a morning bench

trial in Lynchburg Circuit Court. Randolph, who had been free on bond, was jailed after the trial when he failed a court-ordered drug test.

"This was an important case for us today," Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck

Felmlee said. "Witness intimidation will not be tolerated. Any time we hear a report of this occurring, we will vigorously prosecute the offense and will continue to do so until this nonsense comes to a stop."

Randolph was accused of staring

down witness Alonzo Clark during the Jan. 26 trial of 17-year-old Shandre Saunders. Saunders was convicted of the 2007 shooting of Allied Cab driver Greg Powell near
