

Lynchburg man gets seven years for Sunoco robbery

A Lynchburg man who pleaded guilty Friday to the October robbery of the 12th Street Sunoco was sentenced to seven years in prison.

Kenshawl Beverley, 20, pleaded guilty in circuit court to robbery

and use of a firearm in commission of a felony in the Oct. 4 confrontation.

Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Chuck Felmlee said

Beverley entered the convenience store around 11:15 that night,

pointed a revolver at clerk Badawy Eissa and ordered him to open the cash register.

Felmlee said Beverley stole about \$800 from the register before running away.

Ironically, the prosecutor said, Eissa recognized the man in spite of a bandana he had tied over his face. The clerk told investigators that his robber was a regular cus-

tommer at the store.

Felmlee said a tip led police to two brothers who eventually identified Beverley, their cousin, as the robber.

"One of the brothers told police that they observed the defendant putting on the red bandana over his face and getting the gun just
